## ***A Baby Arctic Tern***

### Sequencing Activity



#### **Introduction:**

*Growing up in Alaska: A Baby Arctic Tern* by Constance Taylor takes children through the hatching and growth of a baby Arctic Tern. With this activity, they can practice sequencing, reading comprehension and observation skills.

#### **Goal:**

#### **Activity:**

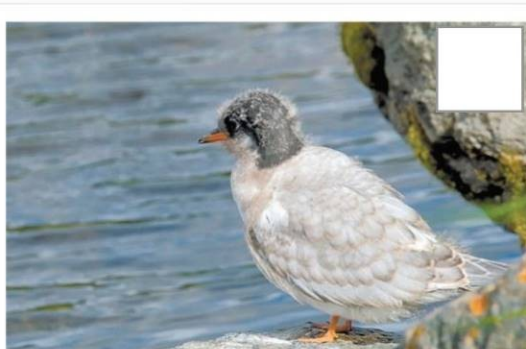


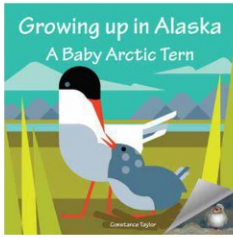

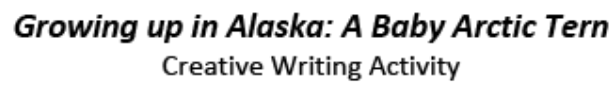

### **Instructions:**

- Give the children a specific amount of time to study the picture on the next page, perhaps 30 or 60 seconds.
- At the end of the time, cover the picture.
- Ask children to write their own detailed description of everything they can remember, or use questions to test their memory.

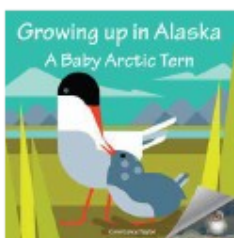
### **Sample Questions:**
